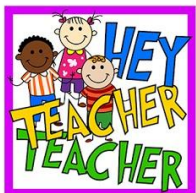

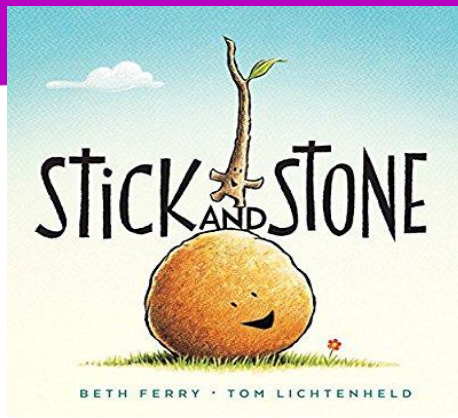

Stick and Stone

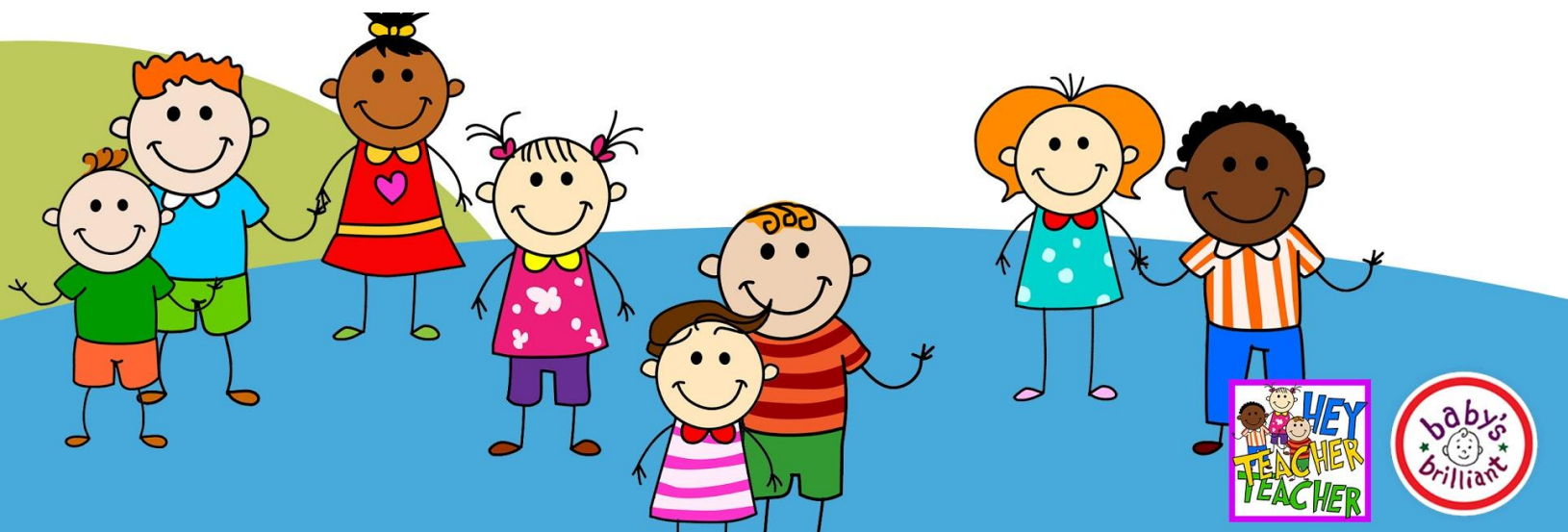
